Research in the International Collaborative



National Benchmarking in Care for the Dying

An opportunity to learn from established national benchmarking and audit centres including the Swedish Registry of Palliative Care and the National Audit of Care at the End of Life (UK). Discussions will include different benchmarking models, quality improvement, staff and relatives' perceptions, and opportunities for international collaboration and joint projects.

Education and Training

Education and training are vital if we are to deliver the best possible care for dying patients and their families. This year's programme includes workshops on communication skills, spirituality, ethics at the end of life, alongside others on teaching skills and education and training for the Serious Illness Care Programme – vital topics for any Palliative Care practitioner.
